history

After voters overwhelmingly approved Article XXII of the California Constitution by passing Proposition 35 in November 2000, public and private entities alike had questions about how to make the best use of the flexibility created by Article XXII. To address these questions, the IDC was established January 23, 2001, as an affiliate of the American Council of Engineering Companies of California.
